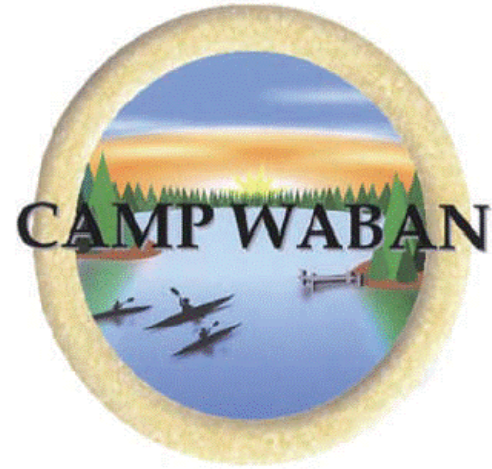
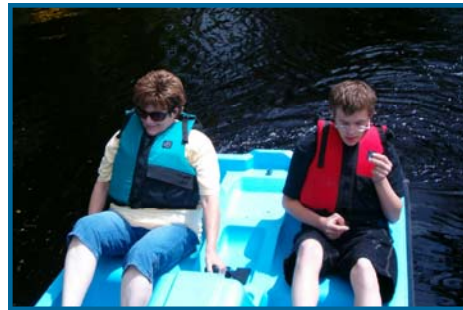

# CAMP WABAN 2010

**Your clients or group will benefit from and enjoy a day or overnight trip to Camp Waban. While at Camp Waban campers will enjoy:**

- A fully accessible waterfront with beach wheelchairs so everyone can enjoy the waterfront, swimming and boating.
- The fully accessible bathhouse, adjacent to the waterfront, with changing areas, showers, and bathrooms .
- Pontoon boat rides around the lake, often seeing; ducks, loons, turtles, and other aquatic animals.
- The pontoon boat, which is accessible to all and has a capacity of 18 riders.
- Swings, climbing structures, playground equipment, and slides provide recreation and sensory opportunities for campers.
- A fully accessible dock for fishing and a fishing license which covers anyone with a disability. Previous campers have enjoyed catching bass, perch, and sunfish in the lake.
- Kayaks, paddle boats, and row boats can be taken around the lake for fun or as part of a therapy routine for campers.
- Lifeguards ensuring safe swimming sessions on a daily basis.
- Sporting equipment that is always available for basketball, wiffleball, tetherball, badminton, soccer, horseshoes, and volleyball.
- Universally accessible hiking and walking trails that bring campers through forests and wetlands providing opportunities for nature exploration.
- Home cooked meals and snacks provided for our overnight campers
- A fire pit by the water for day, evening, and night time campfires.

# Camp Waban

Camp Waban is located on a quiet forested corner of Bauneg Beg Lake, in Sanford, Maine.



Individuals, families, group homes, schools, and organizations serving people with disabilities are welcome to rent the facilities for weeklong and half week, day, and weekend sessions.



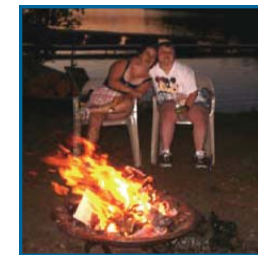
All paths are paved, making the entire camp accessible to every visitor. A beach wheelchair is available for access to the waterfront across the sand.

The bath house, which is adjacent to the waterfront is fully accessible with toilets, shower and changing areas.



Each of the rustic cabins has electricity, bathrooms, a refrigerator, and vary in capacity from 6-16 beds. Washers and dryers are available in most cabins and accessible to all.

Meals will be provided to half-week and weeklong campers. Our staff serves a hot breakfast, bag lunches, and preps dinner for the campers and staff to finish when they are ready to eat. A menu is provided prior to arrival.



Campers are responsible for their own transportation, bedding and toiletries.

Campers must attend with staff. Campers who attend with staff in at 3:1 ratio, will have no cost for staff. Any ratio less than 3:1, staff will pay at the weekly or half-weekly rate.

# FAQs



**Do campers need to be accompanied by staff/family members?**

Yes, Camp Waban requires all campers to attend with a staff or family member who is responsible for all personal care needs.

*Camper to staff ratio must be 3:1 or less.*

**What activities are available at Camp Waban?**



Pontoon boat rides, kayaking, paddle boating, swimming, basketball, volleyball, wiffleball, movies, music, bbq/grilling, playground, nature walks, local area attractions, arts and crafts, and fishing, camp fires.

**Is there a set schedule for the activities offered?** No. All activities are available at all times except the water activities. Campers and staff decide what activities to do when. Water activities are typically available between 9:00 and 3:00.

**Are the cabins wheelchair accessible?**

All cabins have a barrier-free entrance. One cabin has wheelchair accessible shower and two have wheelchair accessible bathrooms. All campers can use the fully accessible bath house for toileting and showering needs at any time.

**What should campers bring?** Campers are responsible for their own bedding and toiletries. They should also bring swimsuits, towels, sunscreen, and warm clothing for evenings or mornings.



**Are Camperships available?**

Yes, please contact the camp director for information regarding camperships.

# Program Options

**Weeklong/Half Week Overnight:** Group homes, schools, families, long term care facilities, and organizations stay in one our cabins for three or five day from Monday through Friday.

They relax in the peacefulness of Bauneg Beg Lake, make new friends around evening campfires, the facilities, making new friends, enjoying swimming, boating, and other recreation activities. Three meals per day and evening snacks are provided.



**Weekend Rentals/Special Events:** Families, church groups, and organizations planning events and special such as meetings, team building activities, birthdays and family reunions enjoy exclusive use of the facilities on the weekends. Up to 50 beds are available for overnight use and the facilities can host over 100 people for day events. Special accommodations can be made for Waban staff to provide Red Cross Certified Lifeguards or home cooked meals.

**Day Use:** Residential homes, schools, long term care



and nursing facilities make frequent visits to Camp Waban for day use. Activities include pontoon boat rides, swimming, kayaking, picnics, and plenty of time soaking up the sun by the water.
