Case Management Services

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Program Description

Waban's Case Management Program is dedicated to providing supportive services to both children and adults with special needs. Our dedicated Case Management team offers support and assistance to individuals and their families in gaining access to and making effective use of educational, medical, psychological and other services available to them, including natural supports within the community.

Through a strengths-based orientation and team approach, it is our goal that individuals and families will develop greater competency and advocacy skills to meet each new challenge and live life to the fullest.

This is a voluntary service. The parent, guardian or individual must consent to services and be a willing participant. The family/team determines the extent of assistance needed in locating new resources and removing barriers.

Children's Services

Criteria

- Children birth to age five who have developmental delays or who have been identified as being at risk for developmental delays.
- Children, birth through age twenty, who have Mental Retardation, Mental Health Disorders, Autism Spectrum Disorders, or other developmental disabilities.

Referrals

- Parents, guardians, physicians, teachers and other social service providers may refer children for case management services.

Services

Both children and adults receive services in the following categories:

- Intake and initial overview
- An individual plan of care (which is completed annually and reviewed every three months)
- Monitoring
- Coordination
- Advocacy

Adult Services

Criteria

- Adults eighteen and older who have a diagnosis of Mental Retardation, Autism, Asperger's or PDD-NOS.

Referrals

- A prospective client or any individual or agency acting on behalf of the adult, can make a referral for case management services. In addition the client and/or guardian must consent to the referral.

Eligibility

- Case Management Services are funded through MaineCare (formally Medicaid). If an individual is not covered by MaineCare, they will be referred to the regional office of the Department of Health and Human Services to determine eligibility.
